1. Approval of the Agenda

2. Protocol of the 6th General Assembly, Davos, June 8, 2000

3. Report by the treasurer

During the year 2000, the society had a net income of CHF 4'299.95, compared to total expenses of CHF 1'833.80. By May 15, 2001, the fortune of the SSB was CHF 17278.45.

4. Report by the Auditor

A. Gisep and K. Ruffieux revised the accounts and suggested to discharge the treasurer. Approval by acclamation

5. Budget 2001

The Budget for 2001 estimates the total expenses to be CHF 5'500.-, compared to an income of CHF 7550.-. The expenses included CHF 1500.- for awards. The budget was accepted by acclamation.

6. Membership Fees for 2001

As approved by acclamation, the membership fees for 2001 are: CHF 50.- for individual members, CHF 10.- for students for institutional members:

CHF 100.- minimum for small enterprises

CHF 300.- for medium size enterprises and

CHF 500.- minimum for large enterprises.

7. Report by the President

- The Executive Committee (EC) met three times
- J. Lemaître was elected as vice president
- The SSB has become a member of the European Society of Biomaterials (ESB).
- as per May 15, 2001, the SSB counts 107 members (105 individuals + 2 institutional)

8. Membership in the ESB

In their meeting in November 2000, The Council of the European Society for Biomaterials agreed to the affiliation of the SSB to the ESB.



9. Web Page

R. Richards and J. ap Gwynn presented the online journal European Cells & Materials (ECM). It was voted by unanimity, that this electronic medium will be the official journal of the SSB. The SSB will be a sponsor to ECM.
